

ALABAMA LEGISLATORS DEPLORE
RACE RIOTS IN THE NORTH
AS CLASH BREAKS OUT IN STATE

Montgomery, Ala., August 1.—Taking note of the race rioting in Chicago and Washington, the senate and house of the Alabama legislature today adopted a joint resolution presented by Representative Dickson, of Jefferson County, calling attention to the peace and amity which exists between the races in the South:

The resolution says:

"Be it resolved by the house of representatives of the state of Alabama, the senate concurring:

"1. That the legislature of Alabama views with much concern and anxiety the highly disordered condition of various communities in the north and middle west, particularly as evidenced by the race riots taking place in the cities of Washington and Chicago, in which there was large loss of human life and property.

"2. That the apparent hatred which exists between the races in these communities is to be deeply deplored, and the sympathy of the people of the United States is extended the conservative and law-abiding citizens of those sections, and who are believed to be wholly out of sympathy with such conditions.

"3. That the people of this state believe that the political and business leaders of those sections ought to be

animated by a better spirit of fraternity and high mindedness and fair dealing in their conduct toward the large number of colored people which have migrated into their midst.

"4. Where it is believed that if those leaders and the people of those states generally were prompted more by humane considerations and a sense of justice which would manifest themselves in a practical way, rather than in a course of conduct based on purely idealistic and theoretic conditions a better spirit would prevail.

"5. That as an example of a nearly ideal approach to cordial and friendly relations they are referred to the fine spirit of mutual understanding which exists between the races in the south."

The resolution went to the senate at once and was also adopted by that body.

Race Trouble.

Mobile, Ala., August 1.—Troubles between negroes and whites at Whiteley, Clark County, Alabama, was reported here late tonight. A white man and a negro were reported killed and it was said a number of negroes who had created trouble were surrounded in the woods near there. Wire trouble between here and Whiteley prevented details of the cause of the trouble being received.
